A report on State level seminar on Natural and Anthropogenic Disasters and Management Strategies organized by Department of Environmental Science

8th June, 2 to 4 pm at Seminar Hall

Introduction

Department of Environmental Science, Sarojini Naidu College for Women organized a seminar on Hazard and Disaster Management on 8th June, 2022 as a part of World Environment Day Celebrations. The topic of the seminar was **Natural and Anthropogenic Disasters and Management Strategies.**

The main aim of the seminar was to remind us all about the need to understand the basic concept of different types of hazards and disasters in context to India and their management strategies adopted by Government and Non-governmental Organizations.

Content

Distinguished environmentalists and eminent personalities Sri Debojyoti Chakraborti (Coordinator, Inter Agency Group, Department of Disaster Management, Govt of West Bengal) and Dr. Sanghamitra Mukherjee (ATI Trainer and Solid Waste Management Specialist) were our guest speakers.

The seminar was inaugurated by pouring water by the respected dignitaries by pouring water on to the plant so as to increase the capacity of life and oxygen in the planet Earth.

Dr. Urmila Ukil, Principal welcomed the Guests audience with an opening speech giving an insight to the importance of Disaster Management Strategies.

Our Governing Body President Dr. Anjan Sinha addressed the audience with an enlightening speech mentioning the importance of disaster knowledge and awareness specially in terms of disaster risks.

Our first Guest Speaker Sri Debojyoti Charaborti shared his knowledge on present scenario of disaster management in special context of West Bengal. He explained the vulnerability status of West Bengal to natural calamities like flood, cyclone, hail storm, thunder squall, drought, landslide, erosion and sometimes to earthquakes because of its geo-morphological, climatic and seismic conditions. Floods and Cyclonic storms occur almost every year in different parts of the State and inflict huge loss of life and property causing untold hardships and trauma in the lives of the people.

He also explained the latest Disaster Management Policy framework with proactive, comprehensive, and sustained approach to disaster management to reduce the detrimental effects of disasters on overall socio-economic development of the state. Disaster Management is a holistic approach which is inclusive of all the activities before, during and after disaster. He elaborated the implementation of Disaster Management Planning with the examples of AMPHAN (2020) and YAAS (2021), the two severe cyclones that recently hit West Bengal Coast.

As we all know that, manmade disasters provoke a serious disruption on the economy, agriculture and health-care sectors of a society, typically producing long lasting effects and sometimes permanent damage. Our second Guest Speaker Dr. Sanghamitra Mukherjee gave her valuable insights on the present scenario on Solid Waste Management Systems in India. In India, with a population of 140 Crore, the average amount of solid waste generated per day is about 1.5 lakh metric tones. She explained different management strategies of these huge amount of waste by Government and Private sectors. She also explained how can we segregate and recycle our waste generated at home. She informed about the dangerous and long-term effects of thermocol (which is a styrene product) which is non-biodegradable as well as carcinogenic.

The seminar was followed by a plantation programme by the Teachers and Students.

Outcome of the seminar

The general response pattern of the seminar was very supportive. In relation to participation, the response was very positive. There was sufficient interest and support to encourage the students to take individual and group initiative to maintain our environment more cleaner and better one.

Title: "Chemistry Behind Phytochemicals used as Herbal Medicine for Treatment of Diseases of Human Being (Series: 4)"

A State Level Seminar on "Chemistry Behind Phytochemicals used as Herbal Medicine for Treatment of Diseases of Human Being (Series: 4)" was organized by the Departments of Chemistry and Botany with the IQAC of Sarojini Naidu College for Women, West Bengal, and the Department of Chemistry of The Bhawanipur Education Society College, West Bengal, on January 03, 2023. This seminar was sponsored by Royal Society of Chemistry, London. Dr. Samir Kanti Datta, Dean of Science, The Bhawanipur Education Society College was the coordinator of this Seminar. Dr. Jharna Barman Nandi, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry, Dr. Namrata Shanu Gupta, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany of Sarojini Naidu College and Professor Anup Kumar Sikdar, Research Advisor of The Bhawanipur Education Society College were the joint coordinators.

The programme started with the welcome address by Dr. Urmila Ukil, the Principal of

SarojiniNaidu College for Women, followed by inaugural address by Dr. Samir Kanti Datta. There were two technical sessions. The first session was chaired by Dr. Samir Kumar Datta of The Bhawanipur Education Society College. Professor AlakeshBisai, Department of Chemical Science, Indian Institute of Science Education and Research, Mohanpur, West Bengal was the invited speaker of the first session. He delivered a lecture on chemical synthesis of natural-products-driven drug molecules. Well-renowned in the field of natural product synthesis, Professor Bisai explained how the phytochemicals inspires the modern-day drug designing against various diseases, including cancer. In a very lucid and interesting lecture he also explained the importance of nature-identical drug molecules over the human- made ones as the human-made drugs may pose serious side effects.

The second technical session was chaired by Professor Anup Kumar Sikdar of The Bhawanipur Education Society College. Renowned Biologist Dr. Abhijit Dey of Department of Biological Science, Presidency University, Kolkata was invited for delivering a lecture inthis session. In a very comprehensive lecture, he shed light on how the biotic and abiotic stress changes the compositions of phytochemicals in plants. He also emphasized on how knowledge of medicinal values of rare different plants, sometimes from very remote places and from harsh-environmental conditions are needed to be disseminated.

Question-answer sessions were conducted at the end of each technical sessions. More than 60 participants were present in this offline seminar, including students and teachers from our college as well as other colleges.


From the active and enthusiastic participation from the Audience it can be said in the conclusion that the seminar was very successful.





The goal of mathematical creative photography is to explore the relationship between mathematical concepts and the natural world, to create abstract images with a mathematical theme, or simply to experiment with new and unusual ways of seeing the world through a lens. The use of mathematical concepts in photography is not new, but the recent advancements in technology have made it easier and more accessible for photographers to explore this style. With the help of computer programs, photographers can manipulate and adjust their images in real-time, allowing them to experiment and refine their work until they achieve the desired result. Additionally, the widespread availability of software and tools has allowed mathematical creative photography to become more popular and accessible to a wider audience.

Overall, mathematical creative photography is a unique and fascinating genre that combines the principles of mathematics with the art of photography. It provides photographers with a new and innovative way to see and interpret the world around them, and to create images that are both visually appealing and conceptually rich.

The Department of English in collaboration with IQAC of the college organized a Lecture and Exhibition on Mathematical Creative Photography, with the objective of promoting interdisciplinary knowledge and introducing new ways of appreciating art and culture. The program was inaugurated by Smt. Archita Bandopadhyay, Department of English, the senior most faculty of the college.

The Welcome address was then delivered by Dr. Urmila Ukil, Principal, Sarojini Naidu college for Women.

The Speaker and Artist was then introduced by Dr. Jaydeep Rishi, Associate Professor, Department of English.

In his speech Prof. Biswatosh Sengupta said:

"Art and Mathematics both play very important roles in human existence. From the dawn of civilization, men have tried to express their feelings and sentiments through various artistic media. In my case, the medium has been photography, which I have been pursuing for the last sixty years.

'Mathematical Photography' is a term I have formulated to a creative process which

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amalgamates both, mathematics and photography; i.e., the process uses mathematical tools to create artistic photographs. Here both the journey and the destination are fascinating as the process makes use of intuition, imagination and mathematical knowledge for artistic pursuit.

My canvases in this exhibition are completely different from conventional Pictorial Photography and are centred on my experiments that started back in 2005, but gathered a more academic hue during the pandemic days. The outcome is a result of my computer-based experiments using mathematical tools and photographs mostly taken during my last visit to Greece, Italy and France and some Daz3 models. I generated various Mathematical forms and curves using different formulas and MATLAB, and combined those with camera shots. An article on the subject titled "Mathematical Photography - A Creative Pursuit" was published in November 2020 issue of FIAP News.

My works include Voronoi, Fractals, 3D, mathematical form and curve using formulas, TSP (Travel Salesman Problem), Stippling's, etc. using various software. These works may not be accepted in conventional photographic Salons, but if it touches the sensitive mind of the viewers, I would consider my endeavour to be successful."

The program ended with Vote of Thanks by Smt. Suparna Bhattacharyya, Associate Professor, Department of English, Sarojini Naidu College for Women.



REPORT OF THE SPECIAL LECTURE ON "ADVANCED WEATHER PREDICTION TECHNIQUES"

A special lecture on "Advanced Weather Prediction Techniques" was organized by the Department of Mathematics, Sarojini Naidu college for Women on 26th August 2022. Chief patron for this Special Lecture was Dr. Anjan Sinha, President of the Governing Body, Sarojini Naidu College for Women, Dr. Urmila Ukil, Principal of Sarojini Naidu College for Women and Dr. Sudeshna Chatterjee, IQAC Coordinator of Sarojini Naidu College for Women.

The main speaker of this programme was **Dr. Munmun Das Gupta**, **Retired Scientist-G/Advisor**, National Centre for Medium Range Weather Forecasting, Ministry of Earth Sciences, Govt, of India. Atmospheric science is an interdisciplinary science, those studies and analyses the processes in the Earth's atmosphere that influence weather conditions and its future state. The accuracy of weather forecasting has improved significantly in recent times due to advent of various technologies.

Numerical weather prediction (NWP) is one such technology that uses numerical models of fluid flow comprising nonlinear dynamics and physical parameterization schemes coupled with state of art computational algorithms. Real-time utilization of the NWP technique for weather predictions, associated data assimilation methods with special emphasis on satellite data, the skill of weather prediction, etc. was discussed with slide presentation. The lecture was very much enjoyable to all of the audiences. More than **70 teaching staff** and about **65 students** of various departments of our college were present in theseminar hall as participants of the Special Lecture. In the inaugural address by the principal **Dr. Urmila Ukil** was very much thankful to the **Department of Mathematics** for organizing Special Lecture on such a interesting subject.


Objective: Students and teachers should be aware about the new development of Fibre Optics and Solar Energy. They should also learn different application of Solar Energy and Fibre optics in different field.

Content- Dr. Ghara introduced various kinds of plant- animal interaction, specially the fig-fig wasp system. She explained in very lucid way how tiny fig-wasps pollinate the fig flowers and how this interaction between them has evolved into mutualism. She showed her own data on the fig- fig wasp system and the conclusions that can be drawn from them.

Outcome- The topic of the seminar is of significance in understanding ecology, evolution and animal behaviour, which are all parts of the curriculum for Zoology subject as well as significant for raising awareness in the general public.
